Summary

The aim of the doctoral thesis *The La Tène culture influences in Pomerania during the Late Pre-Roman Period* is to present and discuss the complex La Tène culture influences in Pomerania during the Late Pre-Roman Period. In the mentioned period Pomerania is the region of the Oksywie culture development and settlement. Moreover, some of the archaeological material points out to the presence of the representatives of the Jastrof culture in the north-east part of Pomerania. So, the first part of the thesis introduces the history of the research in Oksywie- and Jastorf cultures, as well as the current state of research in the La Tène culture influences in Pomerania. Moreover, the first part of the thesis contains the chapters about the chronology of the Late Pre-Roman Period, the basic definitions and the general information about the database.

The further parts of the work contain the extensive analysis and discuss of the archaeological material, which illustrated the La Tène influences in Pomerania. The archaeological finds have been divided into the category of imports, imitations, inspirations and modifications. The analytical chapters deal with dress accessories and jewellery (brooches, necklaces, bracelets and pendants), military (double-edged swords and their metal scabbards, belt-hooks, spear-heads and spear-shoes, spurs), tools (scissors, tongs, hammers, punches), metal vessels (bronze cauldrons with iron rim), elements of carts, as well as material such as graves and their inventory or funeral rites.

The last part of the work is an interpretation of the results and discuss dimensions, stages and characterisation of the complex La Tène influences in Pomerania during the Late Pre-Roman Period. The mentioned classification of the archaeological finds helped in creating the much more sophisticated and expressive picture of the La Tène culture influences in Pomerania. In addition, it was possible to illustrate the range and stages of the influence of La Tène culture in Pomerania by creating maps showing the location of the different categories of finds in southern part of the Baltic Sea Region. Moreover, the results of the studies in the archaeological material shed the light on the chronology in Pomerania.
