Jewish population of the Jarosław poviat in the years 1918 - 1939

Between 1918 and 1939, the Jewish population played an important role in the Jarosław poviat. The time frame for the doctoral dissertation is the period from the end of World War I to the outbreak of World War II. The territorial scope of the work is the Jarosław poviat in the interwar borders, and in particular the Jewish religious communities: Jarosław, Pruchnik, Radymno and Sieniawa. The aim of the dissertation is to discuss the processes taking place within the Jewish community, but also the relations of the Jews with the representatives of other nationalities and religions.

The structure of the Jewish community in the Jarosław poviat was analyzed, in relation to the total population of the poviat, in addition to the Lviv voivodeship. The research covered the number and location, nationality and religion as well as natural movement, which compiled the statistics of births, marriages and deaths of the Israeli Register District in Radymno.

Jewish people from the Jarosław poviat in the interwar period, lived in cities, so the study focuses on the analysis of the image of the urban Jewish society.

The doctoral dissertation deals with the activity of the Jewish community of the Jarosław poviat in the field of economy, social - political, cultural, educational and sports. An important part of the paper is the activity of the Jewish, both in the religious and charitable spheres, as well as in the field of education and administration. An attempt was made to evaluate the relations of the Jewish community with people of other faiths and nationalities. The existence of the Jewish population of the Jarosław poviat was brutally stopped by the outbreak of World War II.
